This position may be part-time or full-time based on the staffing needs of the department and the needs of the applicant. *Candidates with rabbinic ordination may also be considered for a rabbi-in-residence role including teaching and other ritual and pastoral responsibilities*.

Now in its twenty-second year, Rochelle Zell Jewish High School is a private, coeducational Conservative Jewish high school of 156 students (grades 9-12) from over 20 communities in the greater Chicago area. RZJHS employs 62 full and part time faculty and staff. In the fall of 2007, the school moved to a permanent, state-of-the art campus, located on 7.3 acres in Deerfield, Illinois. The school prides itself on providing students with language and tools to navigate the complexity of what it means to live in the 21st century, and fosters a communal ethos of deep and lasting relationships among all four grades and between teachers and students.

Summary of Job Responsibilities

Teachers of Jewish studies at Rochelle Zell are responsible for providing instruction and facilitating student learning in the subjects of Tanach, Talmud and Jewish Thought (typically two of these three subjects in a given year). They are also actively engaged in our *tefillah* program as well as Jewish holiday programming and Shabbatonim.

Jewish day-school experience is a plus.
